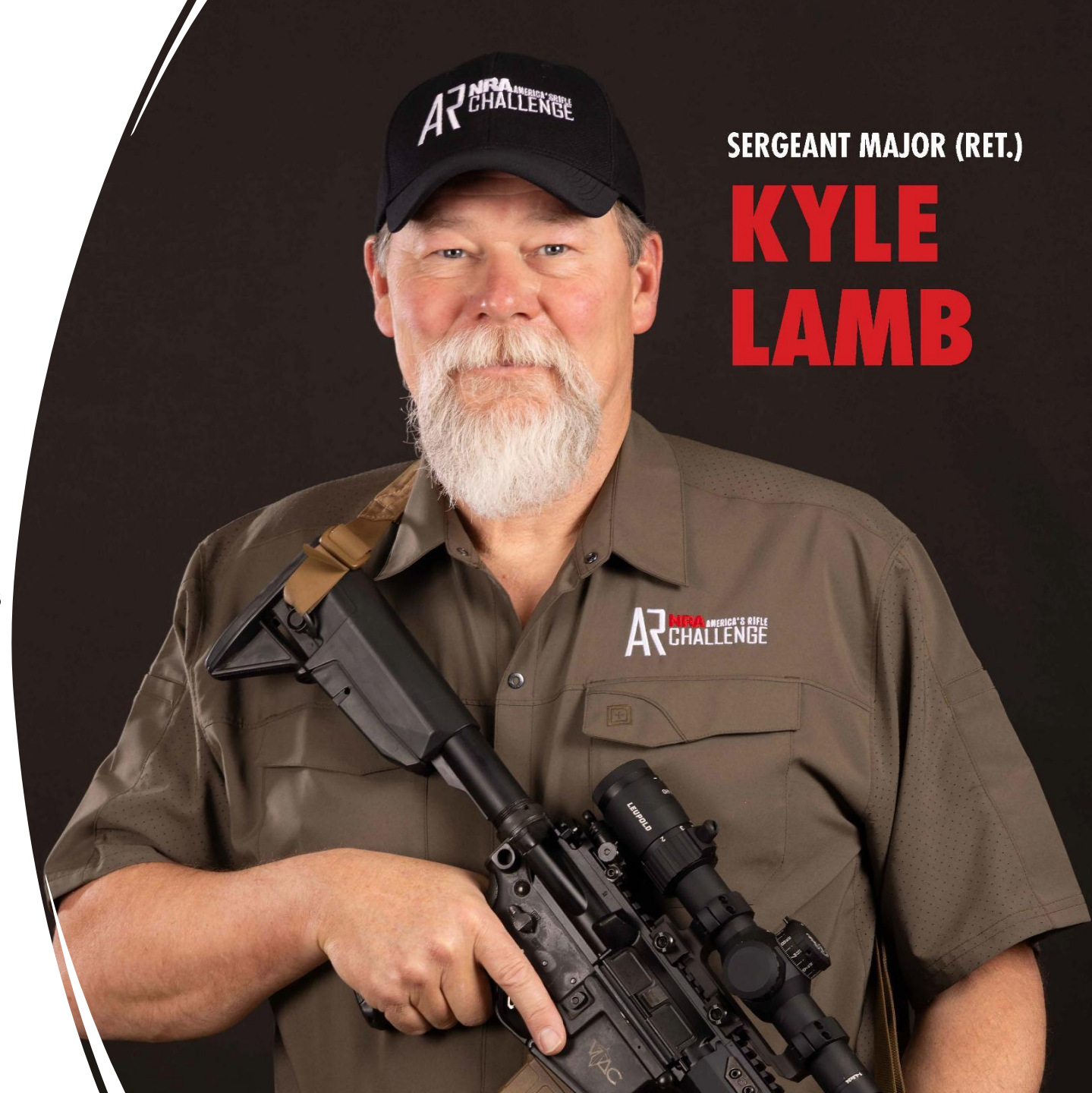
AR NRA CHALLENGE AMERICA'S RIFLE

The NRA America's Rifle Challenge (ARC) is a competitive shooting and training program focusing on the AR platform.

This program provides multiple levels of competition and training, suitable for AR owners with beginner through expert skill levels categorized in three different divisions of Stock, Limited, and Open. Most responsible owners have firearms that meet one or more division requirements.

The NRA ARC program includes:

- Club, postal, state, regional and national matches
- Level 1 & 2 training courses
- Classifications and awards
- Suppressors allowed where legally permitted

NRA ARC is designed to:

- Provide competition and training for responsible AR owners
 - Increase active participation at clubs and ranges
 - Generate revenue for the host

ARC Level I *specifics*

- **Level 1 is a challenging fundamentals and skill builder match, fired from 10 to 100 yards over four standardized stages**

**Reduced range targets allow for hosting ARC Level 1 at facilities with only 25-yard indoor or outdoor ranges*

- **Only 100 rounds per competitor are needed**
- **Fired shoulder to shoulder to maximize number of participants**
- **Centerfire, PCC, and Rimfire are permitted**
- **Minimal match setup, teardown, and easy scoring using Practiscore**

ARC Level 2 *specifics*

- Dynamic and creative stages
- Similar set up and management to other squadded action shooting sports
- Distances from contact out to 400 yards
- Conducted on natural terrain, flat bays, or indoor ranges
- Positional, movement, and precision shooting skills required
- Cardboard, steel, and reactive targets

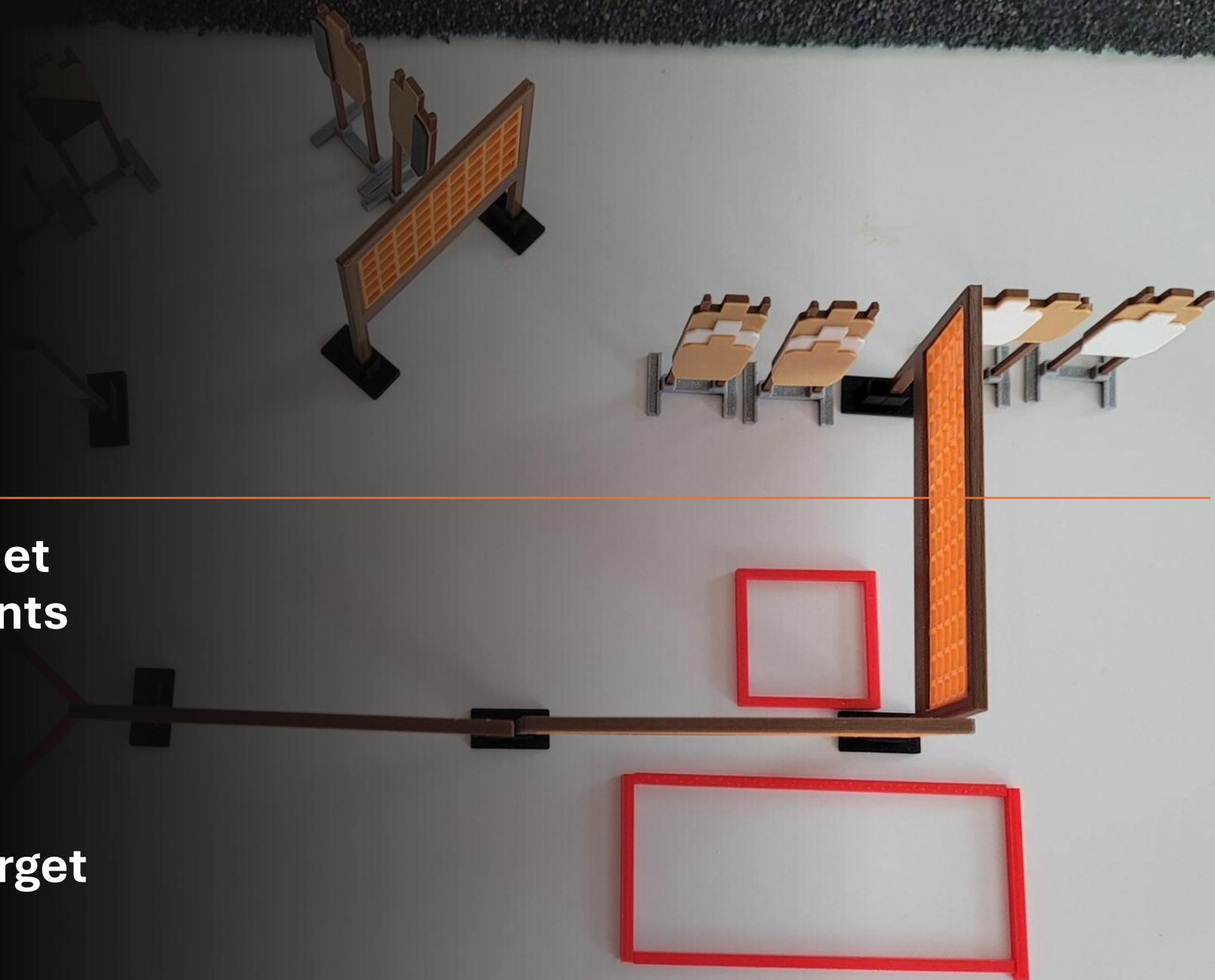


ARC Level 2

**Items used: Simple walls
(hanging or freestanding), target
stands and shooting boxes**



ARC 2Gun *specifics*

- Multi-gun match testing foundational marksmanship incorporating both rifle and pistol platforms
- Uses the same rule-set and format as ARC Level 2 matches
- Local control of stage designs to meet your range needs



ARC Level 1 & 2 Training


- Training courses designed for beginner and intermediate-skilled AR owners in small group classroom settings followed by live fire range exercises
- Presented by club appointed instructors
- Clubs establish the fee structure
- NRA student packages and lesson plans expected to be available soon
- ARC Level 2 training lesson plans are being planned for future development



What Do Participants Need?

- A Carbine Rifle in one of the following three calibers: .223, .308, or 300BLK. Pistol Caliber Carbines or semi-auto handguns are allowed in 9mm, .40, and .45. Firearms must fit into one of the three divisions: Stock, Limited or Open (see rulebook for division requirements)
- A sling for your carbine for all matches and a belt mounted holster for 2Gun
- An Empty Chamber Indicator (ECI)
- A minimum of four rifle magazines
- Hearing and eye protection
- Optional use of suppressors & short barrel rifles where legally permitted

What's Required From The Host Club or Range?

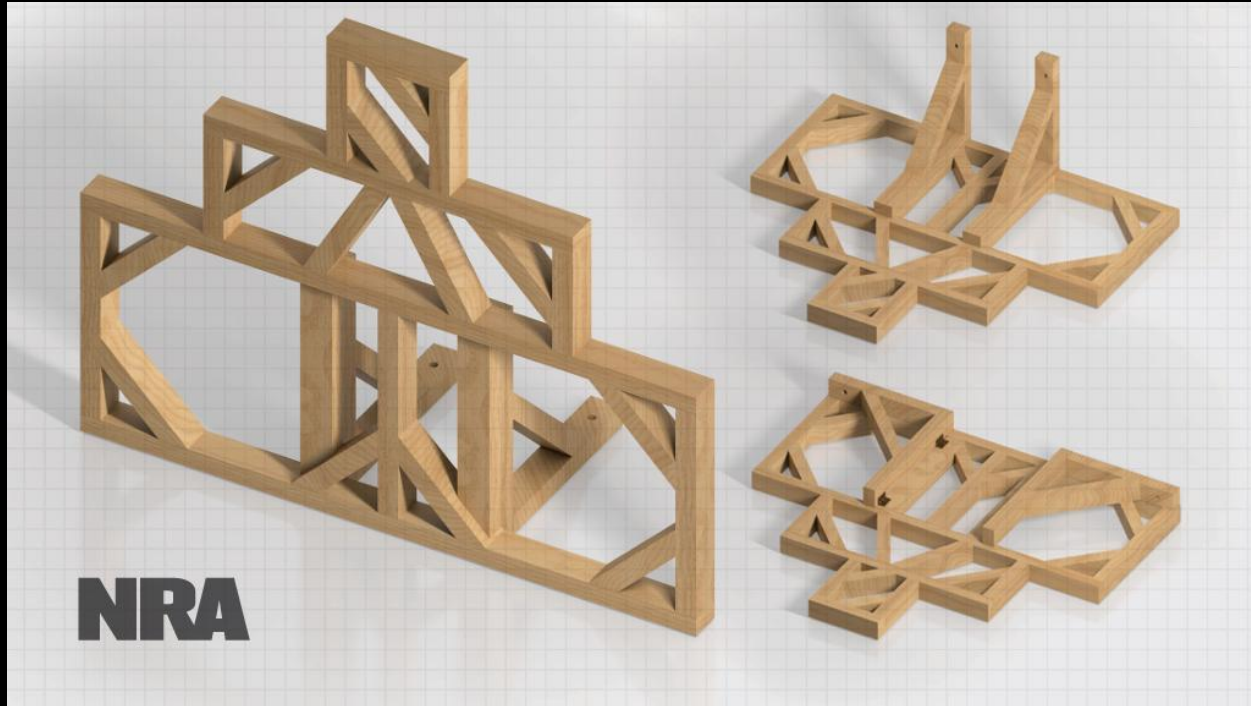
- A host facility with a minimum of a 25-yard range, indoor or outdoor
- A free Practiscore account for your club, allows your club to fully manage events while providing participants a way to find, register, and pay <https://practiscore.com/>
- Electronic shot timer and a scoring tablet such as an iPad or Kindle
- NRA ARC Targets, currently available from the National Target Company <https://nationaltarget.com/>
- NRA ARC Barricade and a 12" Rifle Grade Steel Plate. A paper target may be used where steel is not permitted [nra_arc_barricade_plans.pdf](https://nra-arc-barricade-plans.pdf)
- A free NRA competitor portal account to submit Tournament Applications and score reports <https://competitor.nra.org/>
